Friday, May 10th

15:30-16:30

Alumni Town Meeting. From Austin to Allston: a move in the Law School's Future? Todd Rakoff '75, Dean of the J.D. Program, will be with us to talk about this and other exciting changes brought about by the Law School's new Strategic Plan. Questions and comments are encouraged.

This event will be a great opportunity to share opinions and express concerns. Our feedback is of great importance for the Law School as it faces the possibility of even greater change in the future. The meeting will take place at "Real Chancilleria" (Plaza Nueva s/n), located at a walking distance from the hotels Palacio Santa Paula, Casa Morisca and Parador de San Francisco. The building is a Renaissance palace, used as a royal Tribunal and at present as the Court of Appeal of Granada. After the Seminar there will be a guided visit to this historic monument.

18:30

Registration and welcome at the "Parador Nacional de San Francisco", (Real de la Alhambra s/n). Tel. 958.22.14.40. This XV century convent is today a hotel, located in the heart of the Alhambra. You should arrive by your own means of transportation.

20:15-21:00 Guitar concert by Carmelo Martinez.
 The artist is a well known musician of Spanish classical guitar and will play Spanish composers such as Albeniz (1860-1909), Malats (1872-1912), Granados (1867-1916), Sainz de la Maza (1896-1978) and Tarrega (1852-1909). The concert will take place in “the moorish patio” of the said “Parador of San Francisco”, immediately after the dinner and before the visit to “Palacios Nazaries”.

21:15-23:00 Guided night visit to Palacios Nazaries of the Alhambra.

As you probably know, the Alhambra is a unique monument left by the Arabs, who stayed in Spain during 700 years. It has been declared Inheritance of Mankind by the UNESCO. Considering that it is composed by three different areas (the fortress or “Alcazaba”, the palace or “Palacios Nazaries” and the gardens or “Generalife”) and it is, on the other hand, the Spanish monument that receives the most number of visitors during the year, it is highly recommended to split the visit and particularly have the opportunity to visit the palace at night. We will have special permission to do it at 22:00 hours with a team of three guides, professors of the University of Granada and experts in this monument. (Notice that weather conditions in Granada are changeable, Friday evening activities will be outdoors and the temperature might go down to 10-15 degrees).

23:15 Buses leave for Hotel Santa Paula and Casa Morisca from the central parking.

Saturday, May 11th

9:30 Buses leave from Hotel Santa Paula to the Alhambra.

10:00-13:00 Guided visit to the Alhambra and Generalife gardens. The second part of the visit to the Alhambra will take place during Saturday morning, with the same team of guides and will be focused in the two other areas, the “Alcazaba” and the gardens of “Generalife”. However, the tickets to get into the “Palacios Nazaries” are scheduled at 10:00-10:30. (It is recommendable to wear comfortable shoes).

13:30-15:30 Lunch in the terrace and gardens of the “Parador de San Francisco”. At the end of the visit the lunch will take place in the terrace of the “Parador”, located in the heart of the Alhambra. You will see from the terrace a beautiful view of the Alhambra but notice that, being
